### SPRING 2018

Advanced Legal Research  
Professor Amy Sloan

3 credits

Advanced Legal Research offers an in-depth look at research methods and resources. Topics include: designing a research strategy; research in judicial, legislative and executive materials, both federal and state; extensive coverage of secondary and non-legal resources.

Corporate Finance  
Dean Andy Morriss

3 credits

Corporate Finance is designed to provide students with an understanding of the funding sources and structure of corporate financial transactions. The course will focus on the tools necessary for a lawyer to render legal opinions in the financial sector.

Healthcare Compliance

Healthcare Compliance provides an understanding of the complexities of the healthcare compliance process from practical, business, and legal perspectives. Students will become familiar with the components of an effective compliance plan and program as well as the issues that arise in the implementation and administration of a compliance plan.

### SUMMER 2018

Economics for Lawyers  
Dean Henry Butler

3 credits

Economics for Lawyers exposes students to a broad survey of economic, statistical, financial and accounting concepts which play a crucial role in determining the outcome of legal disputes. The goal of the course is to educate and train students so that they will be better prepared to understand a dispute, craft an argument, or prepare a witness.

Mergers and Acquisitions  
Professor William Sjostrom

3 credits

Mergers and Acquisitions is an essential course for students who are interested in the corporate law field. The course explores legal issues related to mergers and acquisitions. Topics covered include acquisition structures and mechanics, shareholder voting and appraisal rights, board fiduciary duties, federal securities laws requirements, anti-takeover defenses, tax issues, and antitrust considerations.

Sports Law

3 credits

Sports Law considers issues in both intercollegiate and professional sports with an emphasis on constitutional law; tort and criminal law; antitrust, labor law, and other issues of law in the field of sports, such as considerations of Title IX, drug testing, violence, and the role of agents.
