The International and Comparative Law Certificate Program combines core doctrinal courses in international law, including International Business Transactions, Human Rights and International Criminal Law, with experiential courses like the Caribbean Law Clinic, the Immigrant and Human Rights Clinic and externship opportunities. We have courses that overlap with a number of other certificates and we offer a summer abroad program in France. We also have a very strong and active International Law Students Association (ILSA) that works with GlobalJax locally and with ILSA nationally. There is also a Caribbean Law Students Association and a Volunteer Immigrant Students Association (VISA).

Coastal Law’s students have gone on to pursue advanced degrees in international law, have worked at international tribunals, for international criminal defense teams and at firms engaged in international practice. A number of our graduates live and work overseas, and Coastal Law’s graduates practice in the area of immigration law.
