Students are generally required to log on to their computer during a set time at least once a week. Synchronous distance learning may include multimedia components such as group chats, web seminars, video-conferencing, and phone call-ins. DISTANCE EDUCATION												
Asynchronous courses are those in which the professor and the students interact in different places and during different times. Students enrolled in asynchronous courses are able to complete their work whenever their schedules permit.
