Professor of Law - Visiting

Professor Reiber began his legal career as an Associate at Cravath, Swaine & Moore LLP where his practice emphasized securities, mergers and acquisitions, and general commercial litigation. He then became a partner at Gordon, Thomas, Honeywell LLP where his practice emphasized general commercial and professional negligence litigation. He entered law teaching as a visiting assistant professor of law at Seattle University School of Law where he taught civil procedure. He then became an assistant professor of law at Florida Coastal, and successively, an associate and full professor of law without tenure.

Prior to his teaching career he clerked for the Honorable Ronald B. Leighton, United States District Court, Western District of Washington. He lectured for BarBri's Bar review program in Oregon and served on the Washington State Bar Association's Committee on Bar Examiners.

Professor Reiber is also an adjunct professor at Jacksonville University where he teaches tax policy in the school's public policy institute. His scholarship is published in the University of Akron Law Review, Cincinnati Law Review, New Mexico Law Review, and Columbia Journal of Transnational Law
